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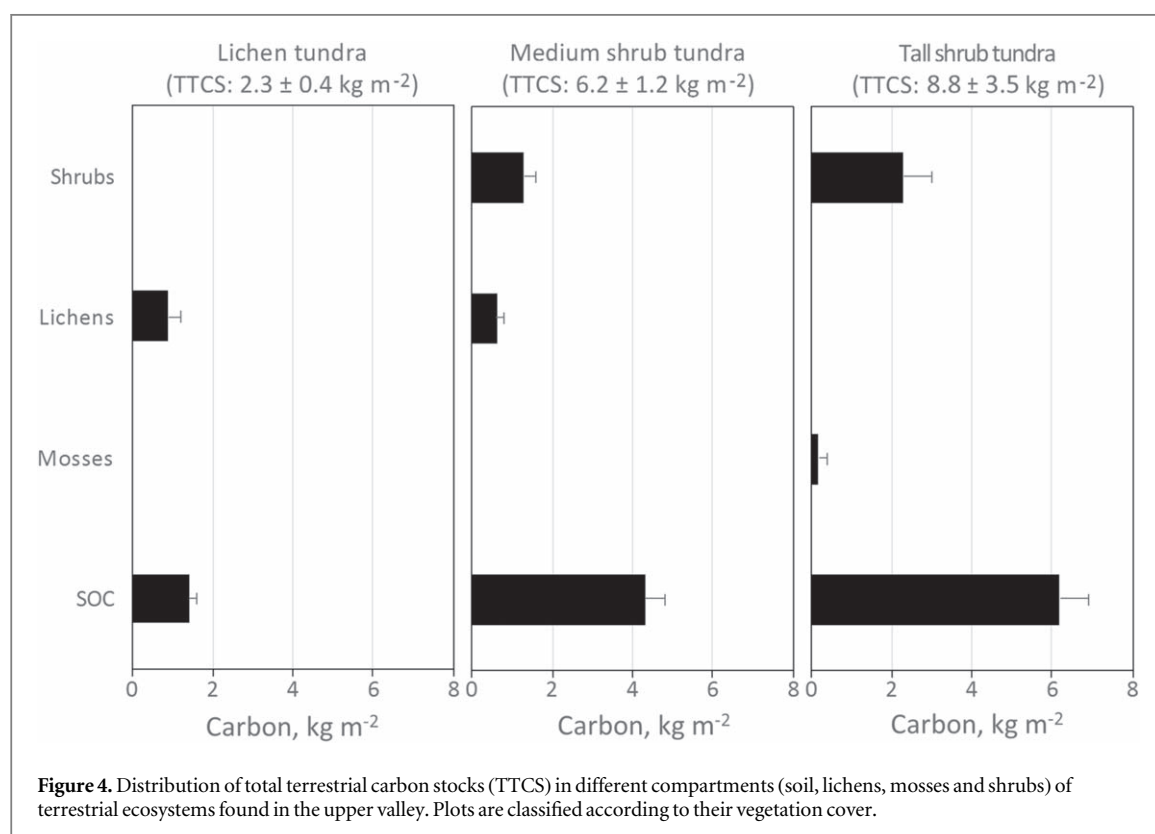

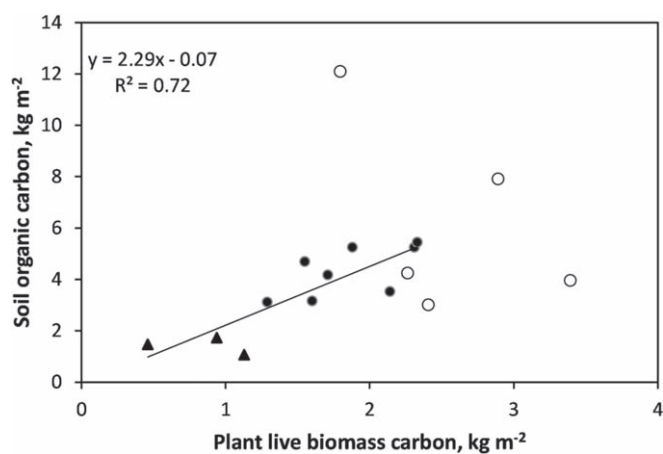


Figure 5. Relationship between soil organic carbon (SOC) content and plant live biomass carbon stock. Closed symbols represent plots sampled in the lichen tundra and in the medium shrub tundra vegetation type. Triangles are for lichen tundra and circles for medium shrub tundra. Open symbols represent plots sampled in the tall shrub tundra type. The regression line is based on data from the lichen tundra and medium shrub tundra plots. As the regression including also the tall shrub tundra was not significant, it is not shown here. Its equation is $y = 1.49 x + 1.58$, $R^2 = 0.17$.

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

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Due to an error in the production process, this article was published with two incorrect figures. The correct versions of figures 4 and 5 are presented below.
