Formatting of the machine-readable tables accompanying the published article included an inadvertent transposition of some values to the right of the decimal place. The error occurred when the first decimal place is zero valued in various entries of Tables 3–7. This formatting error affects only a small subset of entries, 15% or less, is typically small relative to the measured value, and largely within the uncertainty of the reported values except in rare cases including some values reported as logarithms. This error does not occur in the published Lyman continuum fluxes, escape fractions $f_{\text{esc}}^{\text{LyC}}$, or related detection probabilities $P(>N|B)$.

Papers in the LzLCS collaborations are unaffected by this formatting error as they have relied on an internally formatted version rather than the machine-readable tables available through the publisher. The formatting error does not occur in the example tables provided in the published article. Previous publications using the uncorrected values will, by and large, remain consistent with the corrected tables.
